The Price Is Right



THIS AUTO KILL YOU DEPT.

With more cars on the American Road today than ever before, this naturally means more "new drivers" are on the loose. MAD's Driving Safety expert, Irving K. Fribble, has investigated accident reports, and finds that most collisions involving "new" drivers arise from a failure to obey highway signs, a failure to understand hand signals, and mainly a failure

to stop the car in time. To solve the problem of "How to keep these novice drivers alive (so they can keep on buying MAD!), your editors decided to prepare the following article. When we finished, we found we'd solved that other problem instead: "How to reduce the number of cars on the American Road today." You'll comprehend when you read

MAD'S GUIDE FOR NOVICE DRIVERS

INSTRUMENTS AND CONTROLS

•• "Out, damned spot!"—LESTOIL

* The novice driver should be thoroughly familiar with the instruments and controls in and around the dashboard so that he can immediately recognize the moment he's inside an automobile. Yessiree, knowing when you're inside an auto-

mobile is certainly a prerequisite to safe driving! To the right is a picture of things drivers see when they get behind the wheel, directly below are descriptions of what experienced drivers do with 'em so you can make the same mistakes.

HAND SIGNALS

The novice driver should be thoroughly familiar with hand signals so he can know what the driver in front plans to do so he can let the driver in back know what he plans to do,

so when the driver in front doesn't do it, all three of 'em will pile up. Below are some of the more common hand signals used today, and what they're actually saying, if anything.




- (1) **STEERING WHEEL** — To be held with one hand while other hand is around companion in seat beside you.
- (2) **REAR VIEW MIRROR** — To be adjusted so you can see how buddy in back is making out with his companion.
- (3) **HORN** — To be leaned on in order to save wear and tear on next item.
- (4) **BRAKES** — To be applied only if previous item proves ineffective.
- (5) **RADIO** — To be played as loud as possible, drowning out diverting noises like Police whistles.
- (6) **GAS PEDAL** — To be pressed down as far as possible, escaping petty annoyance like Police cars.
- (7) **GLOVE COMPARTMENT** — To be used to store and forget reminders from Police concerning petty violations.
- (8) **WIPER** — To be used as metronome when everybody in car is slightly high and feels like singing.
- (9) **ASH TRAY** — To be used until full, at which time buying new car is in order.

HIGHWAY SIGNS



Get over in the middle, in case you meet two motorcycles coming the other way down opposite sides of the road.




Take better aim at pedestrians, as most of them you'll encounter in this area are small.








Notice that Mr. Fribble first pulls up ahead of the empty space so that he is exactly parallel to the car in front. This is the correct position for preparing to park a car.




Cutting his wheels right, he now backs up until his front wheels are even with the rear wheels of the car in front.




At this point, he cuts wheels in the opposite direction, thus causing the front end of his car to ease into space.




Having accomplished this maneuver, the car need only be pulled forward slightly so that it is centered in space.



This centering within parking area is done so that drivers of cars ahead and behind may leave their own spaces easily.



By utilizing this simple method, parking need not become the bugaboo it usually becomes for inexperienced drivers.

Albrecht Von Neuman



AN ITCH TO PAINT THAT HAD TO BE SCRATCHED

ALBRECHT VON NEUMAN was only 14 when he painted the above masterpiece: "Self-Portrait of a Hot Shot Artist." But already, his sloppy brushwork, his muddy colors and his lack of perspective were obvious. Even at 14, it was obvious that Von Neuman was destined to be a lousy painter.

He was born in Garstenpfluger-Partminklachter, Germany, c. 1412, the third son in a family of five children, all the rest of which were girls. Little is known of his father, which is probably just as well. We do know, however, that Albrecht was apprenticed to a candle-smith at the age of eight, and that he soon became known as the best tallow-dipper west of Essen. In fact, his apprenticeship was not yet over when he was allowed to assume the duties of a journeyman wick-snipper.

Journals of the day tell how he became a favorite of the candle-smith to whom he was apprenticed. A big, jovial man named either Pfeiffer or Raunch, he was fond of dealing young Albrecht rabbit punches to the back of the neck and crying out, "Du bist ein dumkopf, Albrecht."

Despite his success in the candlery, Von Neuman's real interest was in Art. Art, however, had too many other things on his mind to be interested in Von Neuman. So at the age of 12, young Albrecht took up painting instead.

At the outset, he sensed that he had a real flair for portraiture, but lacked the funds to hire a model. The few who volunteered their services free soon changed their minds when they witnessed his leer as he told them that he wanted to paint them in the nude.

Thus, with no model available, he was forced, instead, to paint landscapes in the nude. He was arrested several times for doing this, and, finally, in a fit of depression, he painted his self-portrait that appears on this page.

Though he painted some 500 pictures in later life, the self-portrait remains his worst effort. The original now hangs in a grain silo near Vermillion, South Dakota.

Von Neuman had the singular honor of being the only painter of his period to be ignored by both the Grand Doge of Venice and the Duke of Antwerp. He accepted this social slight philosophically, by killing himself in 1467.
