Kotter was successfully sued in 1981 by the parents of Epstein, Horschak and Barbarino, who claimed the only things their sons ever learned in his class were corny Henny Youngman jokes. 


GILLIGAN (OF "GILLIGAN'S ISLAND")

Archie sold his saloon in 1984 and moved to Washington, D.C., where he now works as a Special Consultant to President Reagan's Affirmative-Action Program.








COL. WILHELM KLINK (OF "HOGAN'S HEROES")




FRED SANFORD (OF "SANFORD AND SON")







Boldly, P.B.S. airs its serious public affairs program during prime time every night of the week because virtually no one is ever watching.




