


SCORCHING LETTER






BALLAD OF ROCKY BALBOA























































































In our complicated, modern world, there are tons of books around which explain how complex and sophisticated contraptions such as the Stronifium Zertometer and the Digital Shovel operate. THE COTTON SWAB

The cotton swab (or "Q" tip, as it's commonly referred to) is a soft plastic stick with little pieces of cotton wrapped on each end.

The cotton swab has no equal when it comes to cleaning out any orifice in the human body. However, since this is a family magazine, we will only discuss cleaning wax out of the ears.




As with any product that is inserted into part of the anatomy, special care must be taken to avoid injuring delicate tissue.

THE DOG LEASH

The dog leash is a leather or cloth strap with a clasp at one end and a loop at the other end.






To use, you simply open the clasp to the desired width and gently clip it to the dog's collar ring.

The key chain is simply a length of chain with a metal or plastic clasp on one end and a key ring on the other end.







The clasp easily attaches to a belt or belt loop while the keys at the other end are safely tucked into a pocket.

THE NUTCRACKER

The basic nutcracker consists of two steel handles joined by a hinge. Each handle has teeth with which to hold the nut in place.






To operate, the nutcracker is held in one hand while the nut is placed between its teeth with the other hand.



It is now easy to walk the dog while controlling its movement. If the dog is large, you may want to make a few turns of the loop end around your hand.




This, however, is not always advisable, especially if your dog happens to be a male in heat with amorous designs on the poodle down the street!



A quick tug on the chain produces the key you require for easy insertion into the keyhole.



It is advisable to make sure no one is home to suddenly open the door with embarrassing results!




To crack the nut, the handles are carefully and slowly brought together. For most nuts a modest amount of pressure will suffice.



Every now and then, certain nuts (notably Brazil nuts) resist being cracked. If both hands must be employed, be sure no one is nearby, since the sudden explosion is like flying shrapnel! 39

THE SAFETY MATCH

The safety match is a small wooden stick with flame producing chemicals at the tip.






What makes it a "safety" match is that it will only light when rubbed against the specially treated "score" on the match box.

THE DESKTOP TAPE DISPENSER

The dispenser is a heavy molded metal or plastic container into which a roll of tape is inserted. It is heavily weighted so that it will stay firmly in place allowing for convenient one-handed use.






Grasping the tape carefully between index finger and thumb, it is pulled across the sharp serrated cutter. A swift downward pull cuts off a piece of the desired length.

DENTAL FLOSS

Dental floss is basically a waxed or unwaxed string that comes in a plastic spool dispenser.





To ready for use, a length of floss is wrapped tightly around the middle finger on each hand.



To use, one merely has to firmly strike the match head against the matchbox strip. (Not too firmly! There are often weak spots in the match stick!)



If a weak spot causes the match stick to break and fly off, make sure you follow its flight path. A lost safety match can lose its safeness mighty fast!



CAUTION

Serrated Cutter Problem #1: Cutter too dull. Tape won't cut, resulting in the heavy dispenser falling off desk!



Serrated Cutter Problem #2: Cutter too sharp. Tape cuts easily, but so do your fingers, resulting in blood and agony!




Next, guided by the index fingers, the floss is pressed between the teeth to dislodge any rotting, decayed food particles stuck there.






