
I remember buying my first issue on a trip with my family to Des Moines. It was issue #49 and the year was 1959. — Lee Polikov, Bellevue, NB

I have been buying your magazine since I was seven years old. September, 1982 was the first issue I bought.




I've been a subscriber for the last 12 years, but I haven't missed an issue since 1972, I was ten years old at the time.
